One of the highlights of our anniversary celebration was the creation of a compelling video, The Foundation Story, that beautifully captures The Foundation's journey, spotlighting our dedicated donors and the profound impact that our grants have on the community. Our calendar of events was equally impactful. The "Hats Off to You" donor reception held at the Samuel Bak Museum saw the enthusiastic participation of 100 guests, a heartwarming testament to the strong community spirit we have fostered. In late August, "Living Legacy Workshop: Family Portraits of Giving" inspired parents and children to create an art collage keepsake. 



Forever Annual Campaign Gifts are permanent funds established during or after your lifetime and dedicated to endowing your Jewish Federation of Omaha Annual Campaign gift in perpetuity.

There are two kinds of Forever Annual Campaign Gifts: The PACE (*Perpetual Annual Campaign Endowment*) and LOJE (*Lion of Judah Endowment*). The required amount for both endowments is 25x the amount you intend to give every year, after lifetime. For Lion of Judah, the Annual Campaign gift is \$5,000 or higher so a woman would establish a fund of at least \$125,000 to ensure the perpetuation of her Lion of Judah giving level. The Foundation invests the funds and the income grows tax-free with both endowments. Currently, The Foundation manages 40 of these endowments and has 35 signed agreements to be funded in the future.

A highest form of tzedakah is giving to a central campaign or community fund. This gift is a noble expression of devotion to the entire Jewish people and each member of the community contributing in this way, increases the impact to the community. Your contributions feed needy Jewish families, fund scholarships for Jewish children to attend Jewish day camps, connects Jewish Nebraskans to Israel, provides support for seniors in need, and so much more!

Roughly \$275,000 of our Annual Campaign is from Forever Gifts – that's just 8% based on \$3.4 million total campaign income.

Our community goal is for 30% of the Annual Campaign gifts, about \$1 million, to come from Forever Annual Campaign Gifts in the next five years. We thank these donors for paving the way.



Robert L. Weinstein passed away on Nov. 11, 2022, at age 76 in Boca Raton, Florida. He was preceded in death by his parents, Herman and Shirley Weinstein.

Robert was born July 8, 1945, in Omaha and he received his B.A. from Oklahoma University and his J.D. from Creighton University. The majority of his professional career was spent building a successful office furniture manufacturing business.

Robert had solid roots in Omaha, his birthplace. In an article published in *The Jewish Press* in 2014, Robert shared, "I'm a nostalgic person about the past, and I have many fond memories of growing up in Omaha - Omaha is my home." Robert lived near 49th and Cass and then the 'Old Bagel' neighborhood," he recalled. "I have fond memories of my Bar Mitzvah by Rabbi Myer Kripke at Beth El. I participated in USY and AZA, enjoyed going to the old Jewish Community Center, and attended camps through the JCC. My time at Camp Herzl reinforced my connection to Judaism."

Weinstein's connections to Omaha led him to arrange for the Robert L. Weinstein Jewish Community Center Early Learning Center Scholarship Endowment Fund. This fund is now active and assists

Jewish families from the Omaha metropolitan area who require financial assistance or scholarships to enable their children to enroll in either childcare or the pre-school program provided through the Pennie Z. Davis Early Learning Center.

Robert's gift will leave a lasting legacy that will significantly impact Omaha's Jewish families for years to come. We are very grateful Robert was part of the Omaha Jewish Community and that the community and its children held a very special place in his heart during all the years he lived elsewhere. Omaha was truly his home.

REMEMBERING BOB NEWMAN

Bob Newman was a man who led by example, his family remembers. He didn't do his volunteer work at the Anti-Defamation League and Jewish Federation of Omaha for recognition, he did it because it was important. He was religious about this work, and considered it his obligation to the community.

Edwin Robert "Bob" Newman, age 93, passed away peacefully on February 3, 2023, surrounded by family. He was born February 5, 1929, in Omaha, Nebraska, to Jule M. and Esther K. Newman. He graduated from Omaha Central High School in 1946. He earned a Bachelor of Civil Engineering at Stanford University in 1950.

Bob's interests were varied: combining the intellectual and the artistic, where math and engineering coexisted with a love of music and museums. In his 80s he took up the piano again; he gave recitals well into his 90s.

After Bob returned from service in the United States Air Force he began working alongside his father, uncles, and brothers, in the family business, Hinky Dinky grocery stores. He helped lead Hinky Dinky to much success. He began as manager in its store planning and construction department, but had numerous different roles during his 22 years with the company. He was Chairman of the Board for his

final 12 years with the firm. At its peak, Hinky Dinky had 18 stores in Omaha, three in Lincoln, four in Des Moines and about 15 in smaller towns.

After Hinky Dinky, he earned his law degree from Creighton University in 1979 and practiced patent, trademark, copyright and trade secret law, first as an associate, then as a partner in the law firm of Henderson and Sturm.

Bob was devoted to the idea of Tzedakah, the Jewish moral obligation to justice and philanthropy. The Anti-Defamation League, the Jewish Federation of Omaha, Temple Israel of Omaha, and the Southern Poverty Law Center were close to Bob's heart.

Bob partnered with the Jewish Federation of Omaha Foundation for his charitable giving, including his LIFE & LEGACY commitment, the E. Robert & Phillis H. Newman Perpetual Annual Campaign Endowment and the Phyllis H. & E. Robert Newman Endowment Fund.

Bob truly lived his life to the fullest, and he will be missed. May his memory be for a blessing.



When you're looking for a way to help those who need it most — and feel good about it – and receive a tax benefit, The Foundation has a variety of funding opportunities to achieve any charitable goal.

PAY IT FORWARD COMMUNITY FUND

This fund is for everyone who would like to show gratitude for the quality of Jewish life we all enjoy. Make a monthly credit or debit card payment starting with a minimum gift of \$18 or make a one-time gift in any amount or pledge an after-lifetime gift. Pay It Forward funds are dedicated to benefiting Omaha Jewish youth.

TZEDEK TEEN FUND

Establish a Tzedek Teen Fund with a one-time contribution of \$125 and The Foundation will add another \$375. Once a year, the teen may donate 10% of his or her fund (\$50) to a Jewish non-profit organization. This fund empowers Jewish teens in 6th-12th grade to make an impact on our community by giving tzedakah and supporting causes important to them. Family and friends can donate to the fund at any time and in any amount. Currently, The Foundation manages 100+ teen funds.

DONOR-ADVISED FUND

These are simple, tax-smart investment opportunities for charitable giving while your money grows tax-free. You can contribute cash, securities or other appreciated assets; you may be eligible for a current year deduction and become more strategic about your giving decisions. You recommend distributions during your lifetime and can leave the remainder to your children, grandchildren or The Foundation as part of your legacy. The Foundation manages over 140 DAFs.

LIFE & LEGACY PROGRAM

In partnership with Harold Grinspoon Foundation and The Foundation, these funds promote after lifetime giving to benefit the Omaha Jewish community and its partner organizations. You select one or more organizations to support and sign a letter of intent with no minimum gift required. Currently, The Foundation administers 680 LIFE & LEGACY commitments.

FOREVER ANNUAL CAMPAIGN GIFT

These are permanent funds established during or after your lifetime and dedicated to endowing your Jewish Federation of Omaha Annual Campaign gift in perpetuity. There are two kinds of Forever Annual Campaign Gifts: The PACE (Perpetual Annual Campaign Endowment) and LOJE (Lion of Judah Endowment). The required amount for both endowments is 25x the amount you intend to give every year, after lifetime. The Foundation invests the funds and the income grows tax-free. Currently, The Foundation manages 40 of these endowments and has 35 signed agreements to be funded in the future.

CHARITABLE GIFT ANNUITY

Through a charitable gift annuity, you can make a gift to the charity of your choice, and receive guaranteed income for yourself and/or a beneficiary of your choice, for life. Annuities can be funded with cash, stock, and mutual funds, as well as non-cash assets like real estate or closely held stock. The payments are fixed for the term of the contract. This is new funding opportunity at The Foundation.



ENDOWMENT FUND

These allow you to give a gift of cash or appreciated assets to establish an endowment at The Foundation, usually in the name of the donor, the donor's family or in memory of a loved one. You can open an endowment fund with a minimum gift of \$10,000. The principal is held in perpetuity while the earnings from the invested assets are distributed per the donor's specifications. You may designate the Federation, a favorite Omaha-area Jewish nonprofit or program to receive annual distributions. Currently, The Foundation manages 400+ endowments.

SUPPORTING FOUNDATION

These are separate legal entities with a separate board created by you and your family. A Supporting Foundation partners with The Foundation to invest the funds, manage the operations and make disbursements as directed by the Supporting Board. Currently, The Foundation manages five Supporting Foundations.


